Teentech 2017 - CONNECTING GIRLS AND TECHNOLOGY

Teentech is a project of the American Association of University Women New Jersey (AAUW NJ) in collaboration with various New Jersey colleges/universities. It is designed to encourage young women to further their education in **S**cience, **T**echnology, **E**ngineering and **M**ath (STEM) fields.

AAUW's report, *Gender Gaps*, indicated that young women lag behind young men in acquiring technical proficiencies. The report cites evidence that girls are more likely to use technology when they see its real-world applications. AAUW's research, *Why So Few?*, documents that women are still underrepresented in high-demand, high-paying STEM careers.

Teentech will be a day of hands-on workshops designed to demonstrate that technology, engineering, and computer science are exciting and relevant. High school girls from all over the state will work together with faculty and students of the host institution to learn and practice technology-based problem-solving in a college laboratory setting. Students must be accompanied by educators and/or adult chaperones who will have their own workshop experience and panel discussion of how to encourage girls to pursue STEM education and career.
